NEWS RELEASE: Domestic Ballots Sent to Marion County Voters for the August 28 Primary

Marion County, FL. –July 24, 2018: The mandated window for Supervisors of Elections to send domestic vote by mail ballots is between the 35th and 28th day before the election. The Marion County Supervisor of Elections office began mailing Primary ballots today, July 24, to nearly 40,000 Marion County voters with requests. Nearly two weeks earlier, on July 13, we mailed nearly 800 ballots to military and overseas voters.

Additional mail ballot requests will be fulfilled as received. The deadline to request that a ballot be mailed for the Primary Election is August 22. To request a mail ballot, visit VoteMarion.com or call 352-620-3290.

Vote by mail ballots are non-forwardable and are sent to the voter's current mailing address on file unless the voter requests the ballot be sent to a different address. The United States Postal Service encourages voters to mail back their voted ballots early to ensure timely receipt by Election Day.

Voted mail ballots can also be dropped off to the secure ballot drop box located outside our office that is available 24/7, or to the inside ballot drop box available during normal business hours. Vote by mail ballots must be received by the Supervisor of Elections office no later than 7 p.m. on Election Day to be counted and will not be accepted at any voting location or early voting site.
