Voters are required to show a current and valid photo and signature identification to vote (F.S. 101.043).

Alternatively, voters have the option of voting by mail or on Election Day. The deadline to request a mail ballot is March 7. Voted mail ballots may also now be dropped off at any open Early Voting site or to the 24/7 ballot drop box outside the Marion County Election Center. Mail ballots must be received by the Supervisor of Elections office no later than 7 p.m. on Election Day to be counted. Election Day is March 17. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at 117 locations and voters are required to vote in their home precinct.
