Marion County August 23 Primary Election Update

Marion County, FL. August 9 - Marion County voters have three options to cast their ballot in the upcoming August 23, 2022 Primary Election: Vote-by-Mail, Early Voting, or on Election Day.

The deadline to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot for the Primary Election is August 13 by 5 p.m. Requests can be made by visiting <u>www.VoteMarion.Gov</u>, calling 352-620-3290, or in person at the Supervisor of Elections office. Mail ballots must be signed by the voter and received by the Supervisor of Elections by 7 p.m. Election Day to be counted.

The USPS encourages voters to mail their ballot at least a week prior to Election Day to ensure timely receipt. Alternatively, mail ballots can be returned to a Secure Ballot Intake Station at the Elections Office, M-F, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. or at any open Early Voting site during Early Voting hours.

Voters can check their mail ballot status by visiting www.VoteMarion.Gov and are encouraged to sign up for email, SMS (text), or voice mail ballot status alerts at www.MarionBallotTrax.com.

Early Voting in Marion County begins Saturday, August 13 and will continue through Saturday, August 20 at nine Early Voting sites open 10 AM to 6 PM at the following locations:

Voters are required to present a current and valid photo and signature identification to vote.
